# SHOOTING CONTEST

## 1:00 pm - Parking Lot

Contestant's will compete in 3 disciplines, handgun, rifle and shotgun. There will be a \$10 entry fee,

ALL FIREARMS WILL BE REQUIRED TO BE IN A CASE UPON ENTERING THE FAIRGROUNDS. ALL FIREARMS MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE CHECK-IN TABLE UNLOADED AND IN A CASE. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!

Each contestant is required to furnish their own ammunition.

Rifles and handguns will be limited to .22 LR - .17's and .22 magnums will NOT be allowed.

Shotguns can be no larger than a 12 gauge. (16's, 20's & .410's are acceptable)

Maximum shell size will be 1 1/8 oz. of shot and the largest shot size allowed is 7 1/2. Maximum of 3 shells in the shotgun.

This contest will be a timed event, with only one participant shooting at a time. Each target missed or left will add 10 seconds to the score. There will be a bonus target for the handgun and rifle that can reduce the score by 20 seconds. Contestants are required to shoot off-hand in the standing position, NO slings, tri-pods, bi-pods, etc.

Each contestant will start with the handgun. Ten bullets will be allowed to knock over 5 plates. Plates will be placed somewhere between 15-20 yards from the firing line. If the contestant has not used all 10 bullets, they may attempt to knock down a bonus target.

The second stage will be .22 rim-fire rifles. Ten bullets will be allowed to tip over 5 RAM silhouettes placed at various yardages from 15 to 40 yards. If the contestant has not used all 10 bullets, they may attempt to knock down a bonus target.

The last stage will be shotgun. Competitors will be allowed 10 shells. There will be 3 still (stationary) targets and 3 moving targets. To launch a moving target the competitor must shoot a still target, on the report of the gun being shot at a still target, the moving target will be thrown from an automatic trap. If no target is thrown or a broken bird is thrown, another bird will be immediately thrown and the shooter will be required to shoot at the first presentable target. Three (3) seconds will be deducted from the score for each miss-thrown target. Still targets will be placed at a range of 20-40 yards. The moving target will be in the range of 20-50 yards. No more than 3 shells will be allowed in the shotgun.

Firearms will be staged (loaded and left at the shooting station) prior to a contestant competing. When changing from one station to another, the firearms must be left at the firing line with the safety in the ON position and pointed down-range. Failure to put your firearm safety to the ON position or point it down-range will result in an additional 30 seconds being added to your score.

Anyone that is 8 years old by January 1 or older may compete. The youth shooters may shoot the handgun course with a rifle.

Medals will be given for the following classes:

- 1 Youth: ages 8-12
  - 2 Adults: ages 13-18
  - 3 Adults: ages 19-49
  - 4 Adults: ages 50 and up
- Overall High Lady



The judges may adjust targets or rules the day of the contest depending on unforeseen circumstances. The judges have the final say on rules and times. Any person not following safe firearm handling procedures, as determined by the judges, will not be allowed to compete and will be asked to leave the premise. NO ALCOHOL before or during the competition.
